First of all

- We had an average of 45 people connected in the 4 sessions

Keynote by John Reid: Reflections on working for 45 years on the Fortran standard

Conclusions, 1

I have given an overview of the construction of 8 Fortran Standards (66, 77, 90, 95, 2003, 2008, 2018, and 2023). The average gap is about 7 years. The longer gaps were all mistakes – the community had moved on too far. Less than 5 years would be too much churn for vendors, users, and even publishers. Alternating big/small revisions did not work well.

I think all of we conveners and chairs have aimed for the sweet spot of 5 years or so, but several failed. I failed with Fortran 2003.

Conclusions, 2

The community wants a single standard. Subsets were ignored. Parts 2 and 3 were ignored. TRs were rarely implemented before the next standard.

I hope I have given you a flavour of what it is like to work on a standard. You need to be there to understand and influence decisions.

We need more input. WG5 used to have people from more countries actively involved. Do consider participating in whatever Fortran activity your country has. In particular, if you are from the UK do consider the new group being formed in the Society of Research Software Engineering.

FortranCon Organization


- Starting point:




- 12 months

 - Find a venue and time close to a big event (e.g. another conference)?



Conference Report


- Videos (youtube) and slides (our server) are available for future reference
